

Introducing RNAO's Black Nurses Task Force

RNAO'S BLACK NURSES TASK FORCE

Mandate:

➤ To actively tackle anti-Black racism and discrimination within the nursing profession – its organizations, regulatory body, associations and the broader health system targeted towards and experienced by Black nurses.

Examples of objectives:

• Expose the current state of collection and reporting of racedisaggregated data in the field of nursing in Ontario and advocate for improvements where there are identified gaps

 Strategize to address micro-aggressions and racism against Black nurses from patients, colleagues and superiors in the workplace

Introducing RNAO's Black Nurses Task Force



- 68 applicants expressed interest
- 87% RNs, 3% NPs, and 10% NSs
- Mandatory eligibility criteria:
 - 1. Identify as a Black person
 - 2. RNAO member
- Anonymized numerical process
- Diverse representation:
 - Sectors (public health, primary care, hospital, home care, long-term care, education, research, administration)
 - Years of nursing practice
 - Various roles/positions
 - RNAO chapters (across Ontario)
- <u>16 final panelists</u> selected


