MEMORANDUM TO: Health System Organizations and Providers

SUBJECT: Update on COVID-19 Preparations and Actions

In follow-up to our last communication, we are pleased to share additional updates from the provincial Health Command Table on key actions that are being taken to address COVID-19:

- Continued actions to support the implementation of the <u>first stage</u> of the government's reopening framework. This includes:
  - Close and ongoing monitoring of public health metrics to carefully assess the impact of reopening activities and the evolution of the outbreak to guide future decision-making;
  - Working with the health sector to support capacity planning for the resumption of scheduled surgeries and procedures;
  - Developing revisions to CMOH Directive #2 to enable the gradual resumption and ramp up of health services as part of reopening; and
  - Ongoing actions to support the implementation of Ontario's updated testing strategy to expand access to testing for Ontarians with COVID-19 symptoms.
- Sustained efforts to address and prevent outbreaks in long-term care homes.
  Building on the successful completion of testing for all residents and staff in homes across the province within the two-week target timeline, the government is:
  - Working in collaboration with Ontario Health and sector partners, including hospitals, to develop stabilization plans for homes with critical needs.
  - Working with the long-term care home sector and Ontario Health to develop strategies to support front-line workers to safely return to their workplace in long-term care homes across Ontario.
- Developing plans to reduce data reporting burden on the health sector during the COVID-19 outbreak, including:
  - Optimizing current reporting requirements and reducing inefficiencies.
  - Improving stakeholder access to COVID-19 information for health sector professionals.
