Clarity from public health re: testing for COVID-19 in LTC homes	 Previous lack of clarity in testing for COVID-19 in LTC homes (various policies from local public health units) Clarification from Doris: new directive makes LTC homes priority for testing. Testing must be conducted for COVID-19 on every symptomatic resident and staff in the long-term care home, including residents who are linked to a COVID-19 outbreak, and including recently deceased residents who were part of the outbreak but who were not previously tested. Public Health units must accept swabs from LTC homes. If you experience difficulty with this, contact Doris: dgrinspun@rnao.ca Kaitlin advised to use regular viral swabs for influenza season. Public Health will automatically run the swab in their unit (use your LTC # and the swabs you send will take priority for testing).

Kaitlin, please share letter templates with Kyle: kdieleman@rnao.ca Obi advised their LTC home has created a designated [locked] isolation wing in the event of a COVID-19 outbreak, as well as a protocol to call families and explain benefits/risks of ventilators, etc. Obi, please share the protocol if you are able to: kdieleman@rnao.ca Currently there is no directive for reporting deaths that are potentially COVID-19 related but not laboratory confirmed. Wendy, please share the coroner's protocol you have access to: kdieleman@rnao.ca
PPE	 All health care providers are to wear a mask at all times given the increased rate of community transmission (in hospitals and LTC homes alike). Goal= 2 masks, per health care provider, per day. Kaitlin advised LTC homes are now required on a daily basis to report their PPE supply and expectations (for need) to the ministry. If you are having difficulty securing sufficient PPE and your regional contact person is slow to respond, connect with Doris dgrinspun@rnao.ca and pgbatten@rnao.ca; Doris will escalate your concerns to the ministry.
Respiratory Outbreak Precautions	 Doris advised to cohort patients with COVID-19 into separate wings/ rooms of LTC homes Isolate and swab any patients with respiratory symptoms +/- fever. Joanne advised this is when her LTC home will initiate goals of care discussions with residents and families.
Self- isolation Protocol	 Policy @ Kaitlin's LTC: require droplet/contact precautions and isolation for all residents entering the LTC home from an outside location (i.e. new admission, re- admission following hospitalization, etc.) for a period of 14 days.

Staffing Challenges	 RNAO staff are developing a protocol for self-isolation- stay tuned for more regarding this. Suggestion from Beverly to utilize palliative care or separate rooms as isolation rooms/ rooms to cohort patients with respiratory symptoms. Staff demanding time off during COVID-19 is not unacceptable unless there is a valid medical reason such as a compromised immune system or underlying medical condition (for which they require a note from their primary care provider). Consider referring staff experiencing stress to this link for free mental health services for Ontario COVID-19 health care providers: https://covid19therapists.com/ Via Nurse houses a list of available RNs, NPs and nursing students (for PSW roles) that are ready to be deployed. Do not wait until your LTC home is short-staffed to begin recruiting extra help; use the following link to access nursing support now: https://myrnao.ca/ltc-home-psw-initiative?city= Additional staff can be used to assist with fall prevention, wound care, medications, etc. Suggestion from Shannon regarding staff shortages: clustering care; reducing
	medication passes from TID to BID whenever possible (i.e. with metformin, for example); removing meds such as vitamin D and changing Tylenol orders to PRN.
