	supply is available; not questioning staff when they call in sick; keeping the MD's out of the facility whenever possible; and utilizing the NP for the most				
	urgent concerns only. In addition to this, the facility has moved the screening to				
	outside vs. inside (i.e. absolutely no access to the building until screening is				
	complete).

	 Hoodo described a new LTC consultation model for COVID at St Joseph's in Hamilton. This was initiated to facilitate residents in LTC obtaining a consultation from emergency department physicians via a virtual platform. The goal is to reduce hospital transfers for LTC residents, and it is a nurse-led model with many community partners (i.e. lab/ diagnostic services, paramedics etc.).
