Presently she coordinates a treatment team that provides a mobile suboxone program in six rural and remote First Nations and at a First Nations high school in Thunder Bay. Her 36-year nursing career has been diverse and includes primary health care, mental health and addictions, adolescent health, maternal and child health, and community health. She has a strong health policy and research background in youth suicide, early psychosis, cancer care, acquired brain injury, community development, and health human resources. She is a member of the Mental Health and Addictions Leadership Council, which is responsible for the implementation of Phase 2 of the Mental Health and Addictions Strategy in Ontario. She is also Co-Chair of the Health Quality Ontario Quality Standards Advisory Committee on Opioid Use Disorder.
